

## Enrolment fees at the University of Cagliari

The enrolment fees depend on the student family income, and range between 0 and 3447.10 €/year with a very large bracket of exemption (for an ISEE “Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator”  $\leq 24,335.11$  € no enrolment fee is due for the first year). They also slightly varies depending on the Faculty and, for the years following the first one, also the academic progress is taken into account. A Regional tax for the right to education may be also due, depending on the specific case.

A stamp duty of 16 €/year is always due.

In order to identify the due fee, foreign students must provide the documentation issued by the competent authority in their country, concerning the family income and assets, translated into Italian (also English and French are accepted) and legalized. ISEE for University use can be requested through a CAF (Tax Advice Centre).

Cases of total exemption are:

- foreign students beneficiary of a scholarship issued by the Italian government;
- refugees and students holding international protection;
- students of Italian citizenship with family permanently residing abroad;
- students coming from very poor countries, who must provide a declaration of the Italian diplomatic mission in their country, attesting that the student does not belong to a family known to be of high income and high social level. The present list of very poor Countries, according to Italian regulations and OECD data, is the following: Afghanistan, Angola, Bangladesh, Benin, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Democratic People’s Republic of Korea, Congo Democratic Republic, Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Haiti, Kiribati, Lao People’s Democratic Republic, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mozambique, Myanmar, Nepal, Niger, Rwanda, Sao Tome & Principe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan, Syrian Arab Republic, Tanzania, Timor-Leste, Togo, Tuvalu, Uganda, Yemen, Zambia;
- students coming from countries in conflict, who will have to provide the same declaration as the previous point.

In case the fee is due, it must be paid in three installment, between October and June.

A contribution between € 26.40 and € 35 is due to participate in the selections for admission to the Study Programmes, except for the admission test to the Programme of Medicine and Surgery (both in Italian and in English) for which the cost is defined according to the procedures available on [universitaly.it](http://universitaly.it).

Students who are beneficiaries or eligible for scholarships granted by the Regional Authority for the Right to University Study of Cagliari (ERSU), are exempted from paying the enrolment fee.
